CALL TO CONFESSION

Silent Confession

Unison Confession (built around the Beatitudes)

O Lord Our God, we believe that You are the God of all Mercy and so we come before you to seek your forgiveness. It is difficult to recognize our own sin and painful to confess it to You. Yet we know that You know us better than we know ourselves and You urge us to bring our whole lives before you in prayer and confession. And so we do.
